Objectives

- Review the copyright law with legal support, and draft proposals for amendments in support of libraries.
- Interest our library community in copyright issues, and the interconnection with library services, access to knowledge and development.
- Organize a campaign so that the library community can adopt a position on copyright, prepare an advocacy plan for policy-makers.
- Present the library proposals to policy-makers, legislators, and local authorities to improve their understanding of library needs.

Achievements

- Launch of a joint Declaration of Principles on Exceptions and Limitations to Copyright for Libraries and Archives by COBESS (Consortium of Higher Educational Libraries of Senegal) and ASBAD (Senegalese library association);
- A new partnership was established with the Senegalese Copyright Office (BSDA), and a commitment from the Ministry of Higher Education and Research was obtained to cooperate with the library community on copyright issues;
- The copyright law was reviewed by a specialist lawyer suggestions for amendments were drafted especially for libraries, persons with disabilities, and education and research;
- The School for Librarians, Archivists and Documentalists (EBAD) will consider adding a specific course on copyright and libraries to its curriculum
