- 62 public librarians trained to become trainers in Kenya, Namibia, Zambia, and Uganda
- Newly skilled trainers have trained 677 librarians in their countries
- Subjects include Facilitation skills;
   Leadership skills; Re-thinking Library
   Spaces, Design Thinking, Learning Circles
   for Online Courses, and more
